"Shane MacGowan was infamous. He'd been 'drunk and bloodied' in virtually every pub in London worth mentioning. He was in a punk group called 'The Nipple Erectors' at the time. I got an assignment from *Melody Maker* to photograph him.

We were walking around the seedy streets behind Leicester Square on a grey London day looking for a perfect place to take a photo and spotted this graffiti. Shane jumped up on the wall to pose. Just then, the old lady walked by and I took the shot. This is the beauty of shooting on the street, you never know what is going to happen.
